### Article Highlight

Dr. Bouvier Williams, Chairman of the BE HR Conference and Director of Talent at DSM North America, shared a study by Deloitte University Press on reinventing and re-imagining the new world of work. According to the Global Human Capital Trends report, the number one most important talent trend, at 78%, was Culture & Engagement. But only 47% of the companies surveyed are somewhat willing or ready to do it.

The theme at the BE HR Conference stressed a major change in mindset and the merging of roles. Brand culture and employee engagement are not just HR topics anymore. They are crucial business issues that can easily be scrutinized, or praised, in the public eye and posted online. At the same time branding is not just left to marketing anymore.
